Christmas Country Dance School (CCDS) held each year between Christmas and New Year's at Berea College in Berea, KY, is great fun! It includes American and English Dance in all their forms, singing, storytelling, making music and some crafts. Morning Song and Parlor bring the community together for sharing talents, rounds, and memories. With 300+ people in attendance, the atmosphere is not as intimate as at the Folk School in Brasstown, but the offerings are more varied than Winter Dance week. The college no longer offers housing in dorms, so accommodations need to be booked separately. The best place to stay is at the Boone Inn and Tavern for the lucky ones who can get in before it fills up, as it is in walking distance. Hotels are a short drive away. The college cafeteria encourages conversation over meals; local restaurants provide variety.
